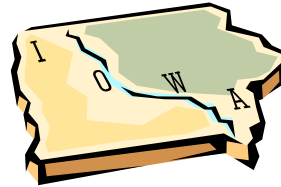

Buffalo Bill (1846 - 1917)



Buffalo Bill was born on February 26, 1846 in Scott County, Iowa. His real name was William F. Cody.



When he was 13 years old, he prospected for gold at Pike's Peak, Colorado.

During the War Between the States, he served as Union Scout.



Buffalo Bill hunted buffalo to feed the workers of the Kansas Pacific Railroad.



But it was his nick name, Buffalo Bill, that made him part legend.



In 1860, at the age of 15, he became a Pony Express Rider.



Shortly thereafter William F. Cody took part in battles against the Indians, including the Cheyenne in 1869.



But now he decided to take on a different role in his life, that of actor.

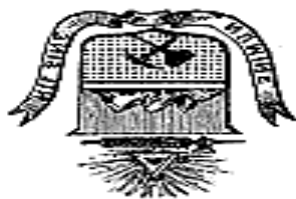


In 1883, William F. Cody created what would become Buffalo Bill's Wild West show.



The show ran for thirty years, from 1883 to 1913. In later years, the show starred Sitting Bull and Annie Oakley.

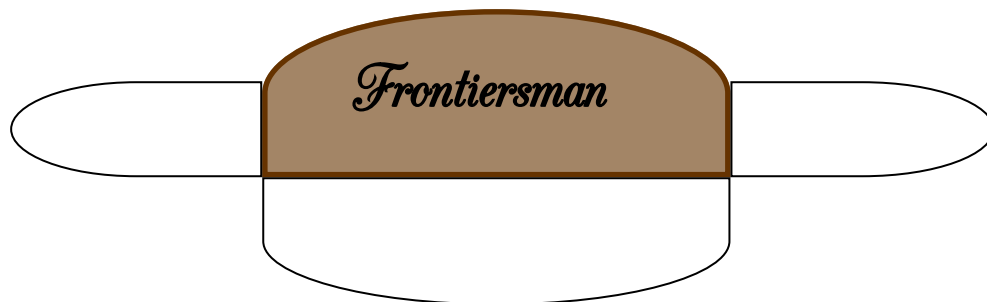
By the turn of the century, Buffalo Bill was probably the most famous American in the world.

Cody was an early advocate of women's suffrage and just treatment of the Indians.



Even though Buffalo Bill had become a symbol of the American frontier, he always looked to the future.





Instructions for meander book:

Cut on solid black lines around the edge of whole page.

Note: Be sure to cut off first square and last square as well.

Cut on the three bold black horizontal lines, but do *not cut all the way through*.

First, fold the cover page back behind page 1, then fold 1 over to page 2.

When you get to page 3, fold page 2 *under* page 3. Then continue accordion fold on that row.

When you get to page 6, fold page 6 *under* page 7.

Continue accordion fold on that row.

When you get to page 10, fold page 10 under 11.

Continue accordion fold.

Cut out pocket and store in mini pocket
