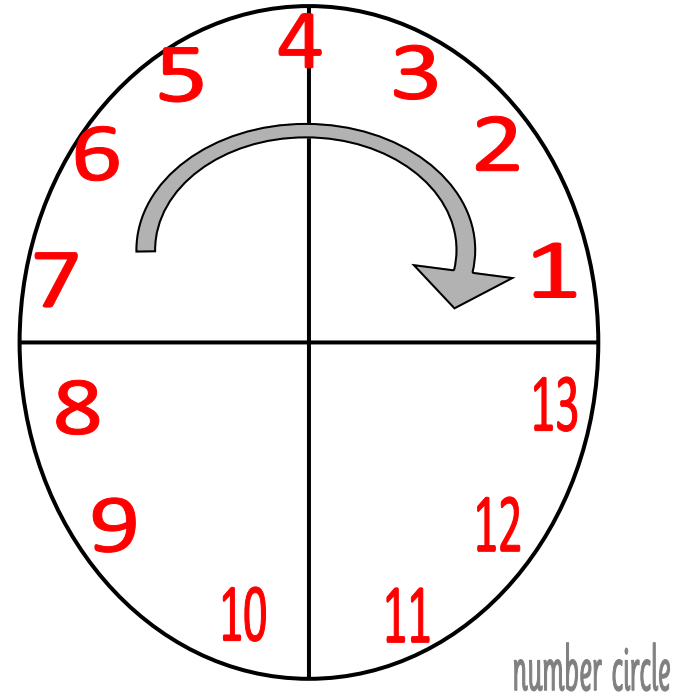


day circle

Lay the two circles next to each other. Line the number 1 up with first mont, Imix. Roll the number circle around the day circle so you can see what day 2 is and 3, etc.

Label the 20 glyphs on this 6 inch wheel. {1- 13 and 1 - 7.}

The priests assigned each calendar day, called *k'in*, a god name and a number between 1 and 13. The day names, with their English translations, are 1 Imix (waterlily), 2 Ik (wind), 3 Ak'bal (night), 4 K'an (corn), 5 Chicchan (snake), 6 Cimi (death head), 7 Manik (hand), 8 Lamat (Venus), 9 Muluc (water), 10 Oc (dog), 11 Chuen (frog), 12 Eb (skull), 13 Ben (corn stalk), 1 Ix (jaguar), 2 Men (eagle), 3 Cib (shell), 4 Caban (earth), 5 Etz'nab (fl int), 6 Cauac (storm cloud), and 7 Ahau (lord).

The first glyph is labeled for you. Start from 1 at Imix and label the day names all the way to 13 which is 13 Ben. Then the number ran out and they started over. So 14 is 1 again or 1 lx as it goes all the way through 20 numbers.
