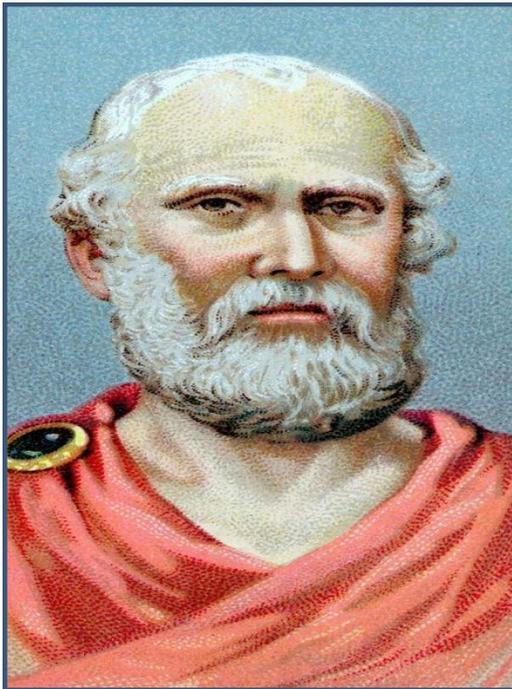

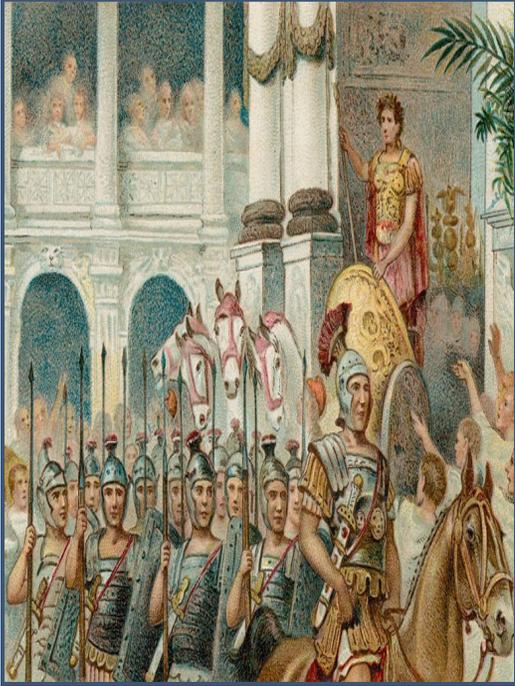
Caesar Augustus

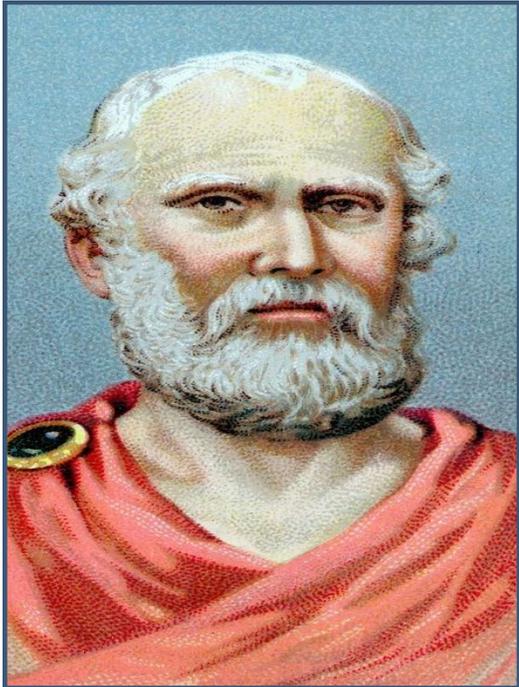


Plato
