
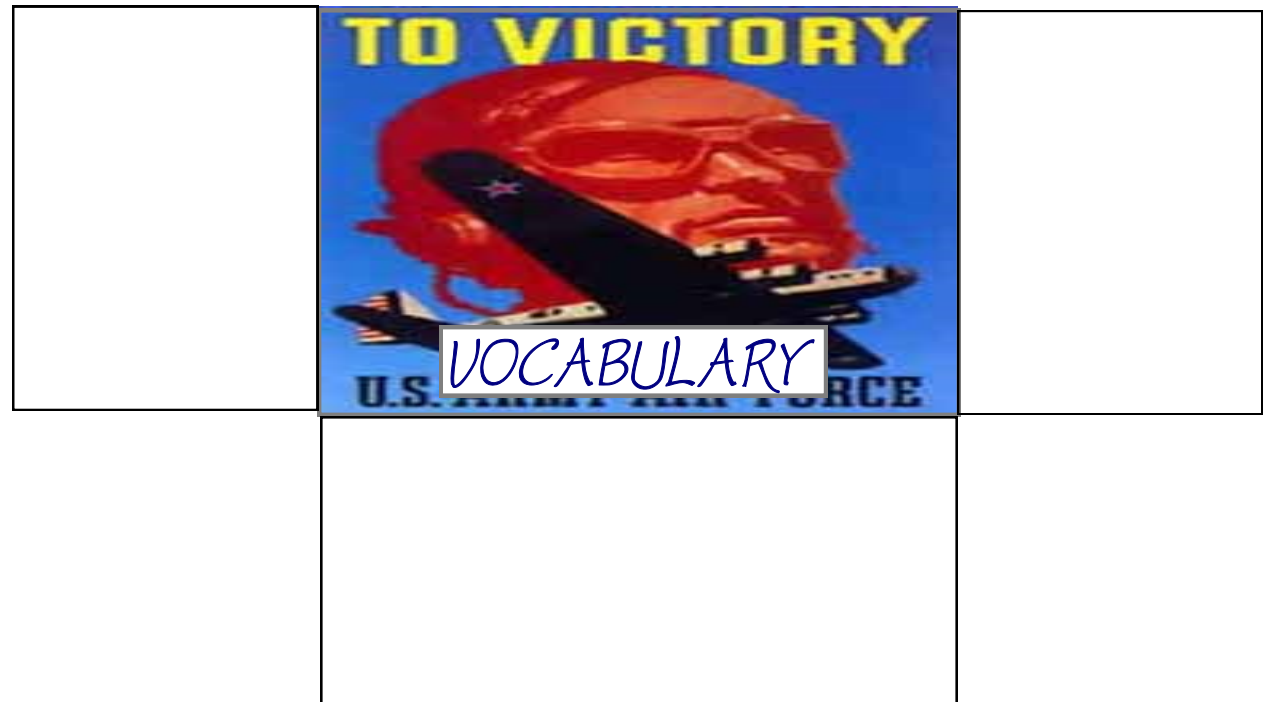
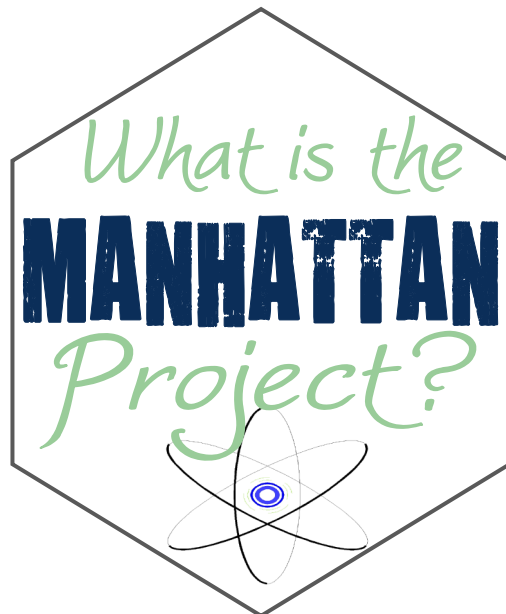

Nazi

A government by a dictator, who rules through terror and control over everything in society.

concentration camps

Prison camps known for very harsh conditions.

rationing

D-day

The first day of any military operation.

war bond

Sold by the government to raise money for the war.

propaganda

Using information to promote a certain viewpoint.

The Blitz

The 1940 bombing of London and other British cities.

segregation

Separation of the races.



Anne Frank

Anne Frank is perhaps the most recognized victim of the Nazi concentration camps because of the diary she left behind.

She gained fame after her death following the publication of her diary, *The Diary of a Young Girl*, which documents her life in hiding from 1942 to 1944, during the German occupation of the Netherlands in World War II.

Anne started writing her diary at age 13, on the day she heard the Dutch minister say that after the war all diaries and letters about the war would be collected. Anne and her family, along with four other people, spent 25 months during World War II living secretly in rooms above her father's office, in order to avoid the concentration camps.

The Nazis learned of their hiding place when it was discovered by some workmen. In March 1945, just 9 months after she was arrested, Anne died of typhus and starvation at Bergen-Belsen, a concentration camp located in northern Germany. She was just 15.
